POSITION: Assistant Professor, Community/Public Health Nutrition

DESCRIPTION: Tenure track, 9-month academic faculty position

POSITION SUMMARY: The Department of Food Science and Human Nutrition at Colorado State University (CSU) invites applications for an Assistant Professor. The 9-month tenure track appointment will begin on August 15, 2019. We are seeking applicants with expertise in behavioral sciences at the individual, policy, systems and/or environmental levels as it relates to nutrition, health promotion and disease prevention. Candidates with a research focus in the priority areas of dissemination and implementation science; innovative behavioral or environmental intervention strategies and methodology; food systems and sustainability; or systems science are encouraged to apply. All areas of community/public health nutrition will be considered, with emphasis on the candidate's capability of directing an innovative and impactful research program. The successful candidate is expected to establish a nationally recognized, externally funded interdisciplinary research program, to integrate their research into existing Department and University priority areas, and to teach and mentor undergraduate and graduate students. The position will have outstanding Department and College of Health and Human Sciences support, strong research and teaching infrastructure, and access to collaborative opportunities both within CSU and with its partners, including the Colorado School of Public Health, the University of Colorado School of Medicine and the Colorado Clinical and Translational Sciences Institute.

QUALIFICATIONS

Required job qualifications:

- Ph.D., Dr.P.H. or other doctoral degree in nutrition, public health, social and behavioral sciences or a closely related field
- Postdoctoral experience or equivalent professional training
- Demonstrated record of peer-reviewed publications of original research
- Grant writing experience
- Experience in conducting observational, behavioral, intervention, and/or policy studies or complex systems methods that impact or explain diet-related outcomes and human health

Preferred job qualifications:

- Minimum of 2 years of postdoctoral training
- Documented evidence of ability to attract research funding
- Research expertise in a priority area
- Evidence of interdisciplinary research and capacity for successful collaboration
- Record of effective teaching and mentorship
- Ability to advance the Department's commitment to diversity and inclusion through research, teaching, and/or outreach with relevant programs, goals and activities
