

The conference is intended to increase knowledge and competence by providing opportunities for learning through lectures, discussion, small group workshops, and interaction with faculty and peers.

At the conclusion of this conference, participants will be able to:

- 1. Describe core principles of billing for developmental-behavioral pediatric problems in a primary care setting; the implications of bullying on child behavior; and how different parenting styles impact child development.
- 2. Discuss atopic dermatitis and its treatment; approaches to acne according to the new guidelines; and differentiate various rashes as presentations of different diseases.
- 3. Approach anticipatory guidance from a new perspective for the child with special health care needs; care for a child with spina bifida according to new standards; and support families dealing with toxic stresses
- 4. Differentiate the array of causes of chronic abdominal pain as well as chronic diarrhea; and the newest information on celiac and how it changes practice.
- 5. Support the adolescent patient in primary care setting as they present with breast masses, contraception challenges and menstrual disorders.
- 6. Describe the unique characteristics of the former preterm infant to improve the care of neonatal abstinence issues, sepsis and general development long-term.
