Message From The Dean



DEAR FRIENDS,

The dedication of the new student residence on the Medical Campus was the culmination of years of planning, collaboration, and investment by our alumni, our friends, and the University. Once construction began, alumni, parents, and friends were incredibly committed to making the medical student residence a reality for our students. They underwrote apartment suites, the lounge, the exercise room, and even a restroom!

The residence is already a game changer. A higher fraction of admitted students chose BUSM this year, and seventy-one percent of the incoming first-year class lives in the student residence. These students enjoy a wonderful spirit of camaraderie—as a second-year student in the building quipped, “The first-year students don’t know how good they have it!” At the September 21 celebration, the student speaker thanked our Dean’s Advisory Board and other donors, summing up, “It was worth it!”

Our commitment to getting this residence built sends a clear message to our students that the School, its alumni, and the parents involved value the total experience of medical education, including a sense of community and collegiality. We understand their need for a safe and affordable living environment and a manageable cost of living. We are dedicated to developing this campus for the benefit of our community, and to enhancing the quality of academic life for our faculty, staff, and students.

One example of our talented students’ incredible initiative and commitment is the Spectrum of Physician Advocacy program—which develops leaders in advocacy who already have significantly affected the communities they serve as well as the broader public health—highlighted in this issue. Our students created the program, a four-year scholarly concentration, to effectively fill the

needs of their patients, and they continue to develop and manage it with the assistance of dedicated faculty advisors who are physician advocates themselves.

Recruiting exceptional faculty leadership is one of our highest priorities, and we are delighted to have recruited an accomplished scholar, teacher, and clinician to further develop our Department of Surgery. Dr. Gerard Doherty arrived on campus in January 2012, and already has made important contributions to the School.

Advancing the School of Medicine through investments in outstanding faculty, students, and staff and providing modern facilities requires significant resources. The many generous contributors listed in our FY 2012 Donor Report included in this issue have helped make these investments possible. 

Caring for Patients: A Sacred Privilege



The 164th entering class of BUSM marched in two lines, greeted by the smiles and clicking cameras of family and friends. With white coats draped over their arms to signify the students' entry into the profession of medicine, they entered the tent raised for the White Coat Ceremony held on Monday, August 6.

"The White Coat Ceremony marks a major life transition—the beginning of your formal medical education," said Dean Karen Antman. "When you put on your white coat for the first time today, the message is not that you are expected to become a professional, but that, as of today, you are now already a part of the profession. When you see your first patients in the coming weeks, you represent the profession."

The 181 members of the entering Class of 2012 were chosen from a pool of 11,780 candidates. They represent 80 undergraduate institutions. Forty-four percent are women; thirty-five percent hold a graduate degree at the master's level or above, and some have more than one advanced degree.

"All of you have met academic and personal challenges; all of you have had successes and failures; all of you have sacrificed much and accomplished a great deal to reach this moment," noted Robert Witzburg, MD '77, associate dean for admissions, as he

presented the class for matriculation. "As you move into the next phase of your journey, your entry into the sacred trust that is the profession of medicine, each of you will struggle. What will sustain you in these difficult moments will be your own skill and talent, your own resilience and strength of character, the support of your classmates, the love of your family and friends, and the commitment of your teachers and mentors."

For the first time at a BUSM White Coat Ceremony, the class was grouped by their Academy of Advisors. BUSM medical students are assigned an academy to which they will belong throughout their medical education. Each of the six academies provides students mentoring and career development and offers ongoing guidance and support from experienced faculty members, educators, and role models of professionalism.

Douglas Hughes, MD, associate dean for academic affairs, called the students to

the podium, while faculty and deans helped them don their white coats to begin their journey. The newest members of the BUSM community recited the Hippocratic Oath led by Samantha Kaplan, MD, assistant dean for diversity and multicultural affairs.

Guest speaker Kenneth Grundfast, MD, assistant dean for student affairs and chair of the Department of Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery, addressed the dramatic change about to take place in their lives as they transitioned from student to physician. "By the time you finish medical school, you will be ready to accept the weighty responsibility that comes when people look to you to help alleviate their suffering, to cure them of cancer, to help restore their mental health, to help them give birth to their children, and to be the doctor for their children. It is a sacred privilege to be given the opportunity to take care of patients. I loved it as a medical student and just as much today."

Thea James, MD, BUSM associate professor of emergency medicine and the immediate past president of the medical and dental staff at Boston Medical Center, has been named assistant dean for diversity and multicultural affairs. Throughout her 20 years of service at BUSM and BMC, she has lectured internationally and received numerous awards for her work in violence prevention, health care disparities, multiculturalism, and health care delivery. She was recently recognized as a "Local Hero" by The Boston Foundation.

Dr. James is a graduate of Georgetown University School of Medicine and completed her residency at Boston Medical Center. She directs the Violence Intervention Advocacy Program at Boston Medical Center and is involved in medical disaster relief missions.



William Cruikshank, PhD, a BUSM professor of medicine with extensive experience in teaching and funded research, has been named assistant dean for diversity and multicultural affairs. Dr. Cruikshank is director of the Molecular Medicine program and is actively involved in the Division of Graduate Medical Sciences Summer Undergraduate Research Program (SURP), which provides research experience for underrepresented minorities and is committed to organizing and implementing outreach programs to attract minorities to bio-

medical research. He will serve as liaison to the Division of Graduate Medical Sciences. Dr. Cruikshank received his PhD in biochemistry from BUSM. His research focuses on the biological activity and potential therapeutic applications of interleukin-16, IL-16.



Gwynneth Offner, PhD, BUSM associate professor of medicine, has been named assistant dean for admissions. Dr. Offner received her BS in chemistry from Wellesley College, her PhD in biochemistry from BUSM, and joined the faculty in 1986. She has served on the Admissions Committee since 2006, and as director of the Master of Arts in Medical Sciences (MAMS) program in the Division of Graduate Medical Sciences and the liaison between BUSM Admissions and the MAMS program since 2010.

Dr. Offner represents our programs on the national level and serves as a mentor for many students hoping to attend medical school. She received the 2010 Educator of the Year Award and has been the principal investigator of a National Institutes of Health-funded research program for 25 years, focusing on the structure and biological functions of mucins, a group of glycoproteins that are part of the non-immune host defense system and are linked to cancer, cystic fibrosis, and inflammatory bowel disease.

BRIAN W. JACK, MD, APPOINTED CHAIR OF DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY MEDICINE AND CHIEF OF FAMILY MEDICINE

Brian W. Jack, MD, has been appointed chair of the Department of Family Medicine at BUSM and chief of Family Medicine at Boston Medical Center. Dr. Jack joined the Department of Family Medicine at Boston University as the founding vice chair for academic affairs. He received his medical degree from the University of Massachusetts and completed his family medicine residency at Brown University, serving as chief resident, in 1984. He completed a fellowship in high-risk obstetrics at Sacred Heart Medical Center, an affiliate of the University of Washington. In 1986, he joined the family medicine department at Brown, where he founded the maternal and child health fellowship program, the first academic fellowship program based in a community health center.



Dr. Jack has authored more than 100 peer-reviewed papers and book chapters; served on grant-review panels for the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development, the Health Resources and Services Administration, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC); and reviewed papers for many leading medical journals. He has been principal investigator of grants from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality, the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Health Resources and Services Administration, and the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute, among others.

Dr. Jack has received numerous awards and recognition. For his work related to improving patient safety at hospital discharge (Project RED), he received the Excellence in Patient Education Innovation award and was named Patient Safety Investigator of the Month by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality. He was also among twenty individuals included on *HealthLeaders* magazine's national "People Who Make Healthcare Better" list. He received the Partner in Public Health Improvement award from the CDC.

He is clinical director of a Kellogg Foundation-funded program in Lesotho focused on improving the quality of district health services via a new family medicine training program he initiated. He has served as a consultant to USAID, the World Bank, the U.S. Department of State, the China Medical Board, and other organizations and boards on the development of primary care in Lesotho, Hungary, Albania, Jordan, Romania, and Vietnam.

"Brian Jack is an outstanding scholar and clinician, dedicated to patient safety and education," said Dean Karen Antman. "We are confident that the Department of Family Medicine will grow and thrive under Dr. Jack's leadership."

AAMC PRESIDENT AND CEO VISITS BUMC

Darrell Kirch, MD, president and CEO of the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC), is on a mission to identify institutions that can serve as catalysts to change health care in the United States. During his visit to Boston University Medical Campus on June 12, he spoke about "The Role of Boston University School of Medicine in Transforming Health Care" before a full Keefer Auditorium crowd.

Dr. Kirch focused on the evolution of health care research, education, and delivery in the United States. He believes that BUSM is well positioned to be part of the solution that remakes the unsustainable health care system currently in place.

"Academic medical centers, like BU School of Medicine and the Medical Campus, have an excellent opportunity to transform health care delivery in the U.S.," he said. "There is a need to connect the broader medical education community, including undergraduate premedical studies, formal medical education, residencies, fellowships, and practicing physicians. This would enable a true continuum of medical education."

"Boston University School of Medicine's mission is clearly demonstrated in the work being done on the Medical Campus, in the community, and abroad," said Dr. Kirch.

the magnitude of what John Silber accomplished at Boston University," says University President Robert A. Brown. "He worked tirelessly to transform the University, introducing ever higher standards in the hiring and promotion of faculty and admission of students. He left an indelible imprint on Boston University and set the foundation for the course to greatness that we are steering today. We owe John a tremendous debt of gratitude."

Silber was born in San Antonio, Texas, to Jewell Silber, a schoolteacher, and Paul Silber, an architect who immigrated to the United States from Berlin in 1902.

He attended Trinity University in San Antonio, where he met his wife, Kathryn (Hon.'01), and graduated with a degree in philosophy. He earned a master's degree in 1952 and a doctorate in 1956 from Yale, both in philosophy, then returned to his home state to teach philosophy at the University of Texas at Austin. He was named chair of the philosophy department in 1962, and dean of UT's College of Arts and Sciences in 1967.

When Silber arrived at BU in 1971, the school bore little resemblance to the institution of today. The campus had only 66 education and research buildings and 42 residence halls, the library had less than a million books, and, most critically, the University was operating at a budget deficit of \$8.8 million.

Silber took an ambitious tack, balancing the University's budget, and launching an aggressive campaign to hire new faculty, first in the humanities and social sciences, then in the life sciences.

New programs and institutes served a range of constituencies and the University Professors Program allowed advanced undergraduates to plan their own curricula. The physical plant improved dramatically as well, doubling in size.

Silber is survived by six daughters, a son, 26 grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren. ■



Larry Atwood, PhD, professor of neurology and a senior geneticist at the Framingham Heart Study (FHS), passed away on June 1.

A highly respected scientist who made significant contributions to the field of statistical genetics, Dr. Atwood joined the FHS in 2001 and was co-chair of the Framingham Genetics Steering Committee, director of the Framingham Genetics Data Management Group, and director of the Framingham Genetic Laboratory. He was also co-director of the SNP Health Association Resource (SHARe), a large project that searched the complete genome for genetic variants that affect hundreds of the traits measured on Framingham participants since 1948.

Atwood received his bachelor's and master's degrees in mathematical sciences from the University of Texas at Dallas and obtained his doctorate in computer science from the University of North Texas in 1986. He then had four years of post-doctoral training in statistical genetics at the Louisiana State University Medical Center in New Orleans. His work took him to the Southwest Foundation for Biomedical Research in San Antonio, Texas, and then to the Division of Epidemiology and Institute of Human Genetics at the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, before he came to BUSM and the FHS.

He is survived by his wife Gina, his daughter and son, and his granddaughter. ■



A Job Worth Doing

GERARD DOHERTY, MD, TAKES THE HELM OF THE DEPARTMENT OF SURGERY

Gerard Doherty is a soft-spoken man with a sense of humor and a keen sense of purpose. He will tell you that as a third-year medical student who thought he was going to be an internist, it was the surgical patients who interested him the most. "I found that as the patients went to surgery to have their problem fixed, I liked finding out whether the early decisions we made were right or wrong," Doherty recalls. "Whether our diagnoses and plans held up, our choices were out there for all to see. That is what attracted me to surgery."

He brings that desire for clarity and precision to his role as the James Utley Professor and Chair of the BUSM Department of Surgery and BMC surgeon-in-chief. Doherty came to the

Medical Campus in January from the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, where for the past decade he was the N.W. Thompson Professor and Head of General Surgery and the surgery residency program director.

A Yale University School of Medicine graduate who trained in general surgery at the University of California-San Francisco and completed a surgical oncology fellowship at the National Cancer Institute (NCI), Doherty's clinical and research interests focus on surgical diseases of the thyroid; parathyroid; endocrine; pancreas; and adrenal glands; as well as the management of multiple endocrine neoplasia syndromes.

Doherty also spent a year at the Healthcare Leadership Institute at the University of Michigan's Ross School of Business. His bibliography includes more than 250 publications and edited books. He serves on the Board of Directors of the American Thyroid Association, was president

of the Michigan Chapter of the American College of Surgeons, and council coordinator of the International Association of Endocrine Surgeons. He is also an associate editor of the *World Journal of Surgery* and sits on a number of editorial boards.

"We are pleased to have such a strong leader on the BUSM faculty," says Dean Karen Antman. "He is an accomplished surgical investigator with two decades of experience in academic administration and research."

"In every job I have taken since I finished residency, even the jobs within the job, I have always tried to be careful to choose to do something worth accomplishing," says Doherty. "When I came here I found a job that is worth doing and needs to be done. This department has all the essentials of a very good surgery program—excellent faculty, talented residents and students, a supportive medical school, and a high-quality hospital. All of the fundamentals are here and yet they haven't been fully realized and have not been completely put together."

"I thought that if I could add that piece of coalescence, I would be making a worthwhile contribution and help raise the department to the level where it should be."

"The community here is a remarkable group. Everyone who surrounds the department

has truly been constructive, thoughtful, and helpful. People are what make any place special; the most important thing I learned from the Healthcare Leadership Program at the University of Michigan is appreciating that fact. Leadership is figuring out what motivates different people in different situations. The only way our institutions truly succeed is when the individuals who comprise them succeed in their own careers with leaders who can connect individuals and groups together."

Doherty's goals include forging a full-service department for both general and specialty surgery. He has already included cardiothoracic and plastic surgery, which previously were separate units. He is also recruiting to support the services the department offers and its plans for expansion.

"We must meet the diverse needs of our patients and have the breadth and depth of training for residents and medical students," Doherty says. "We need to have avenues for faculty development." He estimates that 40 percent of the department's surgical service is standard care for any large community hospital for general surgical issues; another 40 percent is related to the trauma center where patients come in through the Emergency Department or transfer from other hospitals with complicated acute surgical issues; and the remaining 20 percent will be in specific areas of patient need in which the department faculty are expert.

"Our areas of strength include endocrine and oncology surgery, my specialty, with the expertise of David McAneny and Michael Stone," notes Doherty. "We also have an outstanding bariatric surgery weight loss program under the direction of Donald Hess, which is extraordinarily high quality and productive. We will focus there because it is also a need of our patient population. The third area we should focus on for both clinical care and research is abdominal wall reconstruction.

This is a complex surgery for people who have had abdominal wall failure either through traumatic injury, severe surgical complications, or multiple hernia problems. We have surgical as well as research expertise in the department."

Doherty has been working with the College of Engineering to build multidisciplinary groups to capitalize on the expertise in both the School of Medicine and College of Engineering in this

area. "Abdominal wall failures are a major clinical problem," he says. "We need to replace the options we have now. Working with biomedical engineering, we may be able to marry the bio-pharmacology of adhesion formation and the bioengineering of synthetic material into better ways to heal the abdominal wall."

He has made the surgical residency program a priority and has assumed the role of interim director focusing on organization and team work. He has appointed two new associate program directors, decreased the number of preliminary residents, added advanced care practitioners to the service in the form of physician assistants (PAs) and nurse practitioners (NPs) so that the residents can focus more on the training aspects of the service, and changed the residents' daily schedule.

"There are a lot of moving parts to the residency and probably no single aspect of it has been left untouched," says Doherty. "Previously early morning conferences made it hard for surgical teams to make rounds together and for the team to plan for the day. You have to start with the team together at some point, and morning rounds are important to educate our surgeons, nursing staff, residents, and students about how their behavior is important to the team." Doherty said the didactics have been improved so that all of the faculty can be involved in the lecture schedule and case presentations for the residents.

"We have added advanced care practitioners into the mix to create integrated teams with NPs and PAs who offer great care and a host of complementary skills. Another layer of providers improves patient care and adds more mentors for the residents and medical students."

He notes that the department's medical student program is excellent under the direction of Jane Mendez, MD, associate professor of surgery. "Luckily, we have Dr. Mendez, an outstanding surgeon and clerkship director who can be credited with careful oversight of the training the students get and the interactions they have with the surgical team."

Doherty has also been focusing on a relationship with the Neighborhood Health Centers to better tie the surgical program and services with the network of centers. "We are working to see that BUSM and BMC have a visible role in the health centers and their functions," he says. "We need to better

collaborate on patient care in the surgical arena. Surgical patients are most vulnerable, and we need to do a good job of transitioning them from the hospital to the centers in order to avoid complications and readmissions. Our patients have multiple problems, so we need to ensure that our care doesn't make it harder for them to manage their health."

Doherty also finds that the discussions he has here at the hospital, medical school, and department levels are similar to the ones he had at his previous institution. "Everyone is challenged by shrinking health care dollars and the increasing expense of care," he explains. "How can we be more efficient and make the best choices in what we do or don't do? What is different at this medical center is that our people are here explicitly because of the mission. The reality of the limited resources related to the patient population that we serve

is a feature of the environment but does not dominate it."

When he is not dealing with one issue or another at the Department of Surgery, Doherty is involved in initiatives championed by the American College of Surgeons such as emergency licensing of physicians, which is both a national and state issue. "The Uniform Emergency Volunteer Health Practitioners Act has been passed in about one-third of the states, but not in Massachusetts," says Doherty. "If a disaster should occur here, only Massachusetts-licensed physicians could respond, whereas in Louisiana, for example, out-of-state physicians can volunteer and provide care. We are working to get this passed here."

On a personal note, Doherty has set an additional goal for himself. Although he speaks and understands French, "I think if I could learn to speak Haitian Creole, I could make a contribution to patient care here."

New Student Residence Dedicated

Convenient, Affordable Housing for Medical Students Celebrated

In Friday, September 21, Boston University President Robert Brown and Boston University School of Medicine Dean Karen Antman hosted the dedication of the new student residence on the Medical Campus.

Part of BU's Alumni Weekend events, the dedication was the culmination of more than five years of planning, fundraising, design, and construction.

Members of the Boston University Board of Trustees and School of Medicine Dean's Advisory Board gathered with donors to the residence, alumni, parents, faculty, staff, and students on a beautiful fall day to celebrate—and recognize the importance of having convenient, affordable living accommodations for Boston University's medical students.

Looking down Albany Street, it is hard to miss the brick-and-limestone façade of the nine-story residence. Fully occupied by 208 BUSM students, the residence and its adjacent park provide modern, apartment-style facilities in the highly desirable neighborhood that surrounds the Medical Campus.

"We enjoyed a very special opening of the academic year at the BU School of Medicine this past summer," said President Brown. "For the first time, we have been able to provide on-campus housing.

"The demands placed on medical students are among the most rigorous in all of the academic world. By being able to provide

housing to so many medical students within close walking distance of the classrooms, labs, and clinical facilities of the Medical Campus, we are able to ease their burdens, foster a sense of community, and offer a richer educational experience.

The \$33 million residence is a state-of-the-art, 88,000-square-foot building designed to serve the needs of medical students. The building comprises 104 fully furnished two-bedroom suites, eight of which are ADA compliant. Each suite features a full bath, kitchenette with new appliances, high-speed data capability, and a common living area.

The first floor of the building includes a student lounge and a fitness center. Named in honor of BUSM Dean's Advisory Board member Shamim Dahod, MD '87 (CGS'76, CAS'78) and her husband Ashraf Dahod, whose generosity helped make the residence a reality, the 1,300-square-foot lounge is bathed in natural light through its many windows and is designed to be a retreat where students can relax with friends, watch television, or study.

A fully equipped kitchen is adjacent to the lounge. The fitness center, named the Serchuck Family Exercise Room in honor of the generosity of former Dean's Advisory Board Chair Jerome Serchuck, includes treadmills, elliptical cross-trainers, and recumbent and upright bikes. This room is accessible to residents by keycard.

The living space, which includes all utilities plus amenities such as onsite laundry facilities and air conditioning, is available for \$850 per student per month, considerably less than the average Boston monthly rent of \$1,949 for a one-bedroom apartment and \$2,438 for a two-bedroom.

"The student residence is more than bricks and mortar," said Dean Antman. "For medical students, the residence is a living and learning environment that fosters collaboration and collegiality both here and in the classroom. It is a lower-cost, safer alternative to long commutes by sleep-deprived medical students."

Residents also have access to a 9,000-square-foot park surrounding the building that features a variety of ornamental, deciduous, and evergreen trees. Flowering and evergreen shrubs add seasonal shade and color, while lovely perennials, bulbs, and annuals are ongoing. The main source of water for irrigation is collected

on the roof of the residence and stored in a tank buried in the park. Eco-friendly drip irrigation—the slow, precise application of water directly to the plants' root zones—maintains an optimum moisture

level, efficiently conserving water that might otherwise be lost to non-growth areas, runoff, sun, or wind. The limited lawn areas use underground sprinklers.

As part of the University's commitment to sustainability, BU has applied for LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification for the building, which is a suite of rating systems for the design, construction, and operation of high-performance green buildings, homes, and neighborhoods.

Addressing the assembled guests at the dedication, fourth-year medical student Amrita Devalapalli explained that the new residence has already proved to be important to residents in their



Training Patient Advocates Starts in Medical School

Innovative BUSM Spectrum of Physician Advocacy Program Trains Medical Advocacy Leaders

There is a saying on the BU Medical Campus that a cancer diagnosis may not be your patient's biggest problem. Patients more adversely affected by societal ills like poverty and environmental issues like poor housing face a host of issues, of which a life-threatening disease may be only one. To provide appropriate and effective treatment for their patients and to promote their health, physicians become advocates, but advocacy training was not part of formal medical education.

Students at Boston University School of Medicine (BUSM) have developed a program to rectify that gap. Eight years ago, then-medical student Chen Kenyon, MD '06, led the creation of a first-year elective, the Spectrum of Physician Advocacy, mentored by Robert Witzburg, MD '77, BUSM associate dean for admissions.

That single elective has now blossomed into the BU Advocacy Training Program (BU ATP), which offers curriculum throughout the four years of medical school and features a pilot that was recently approved by the School of Medicine as a scholarly concentration. Because BUSM's Advocacy Training Program is student-created and

directed under faculty mentorship, students have developed not only as physician advocates but as leaders of physician advocacy, as well.

"The way we define advocacy as a skill set is anchored in the social determinants of health," says Megan Sandel, MD, BUSM associate professor of pediatrics and public health and faculty director of the BU Advocacy Training Program. "We have developed a program to help students interact with systems to improve the health of their patients. Leadership development among students, a key component of the program, really distinguishes it from other advocacy training programs."

The program comprises a first-year course focused on the social determinants of health taught by students who have already taken the course and faculty engaged in advocacy, and a second-year course focused on interdisciplinary learning taught by medical and law students, and physicians and lawyers engaged in advocacy. In the third year, students learn from case-based online modules related to the rotations they are taking that year, and in the fourth year they choose an advocacy project mentored by a faculty member.

"We offer an advocacy training program for anyone who wants to be involved at whatever level, as students can take the four-year concentration or they can take components of the program," Sandel notes. "A fitting analogy is that everyone takes cardiology in medical school with the understanding that not everyone is going to be a cardiologist, but we think learning how the heart works is inherent to being a good physician. Every physician should at least be aware of advocacy skills and competencies, while a certain subset is going to go on to be that advocacy specialist, which will be a career-defining part of their profession. I think we want our curriculum offerings to be able to toggle between both."

The BU ATP trains medical students in the theory and practice of advocating for the health and well-being of patients and their communities. "At the end of medical school we want our students to be able to understand the social determinants of health at a theoretical level," says Lauren Fiechtner, MD '09, alumni director of the program and recent graduate of the combined BMC-Boston Children's Hospital pediatrics program. "They also will be able to screen patients for social risk factors affecting their current and future health, intervene directly to address the social issues disrupting a patient's health at the individual or community levels, and leverage resources to effect broader change by addressing these social issues at the community, state, national, or international levels."

Approximately 15 percent of each medical school class participates in the program. Of that percentage, a cohort of students go on to teach in the program, mastering content and resources while acquiring the skills and techniques necessary for being educators. They also become

mentors to their fellow students. "As a resident you have to teach but you aren't formally taught how to teach in medical school. This program provides that opportunity," notes Fiechtner.

The curriculum addresses how advocacy can be applied to direct patient care, why advocacy is linked to the mission of medicine, how to highlight health disparities that exist at all levels, and how to identify local trends in health outcomes and potential interventions to ameliorate the inequities. Students learn to translate patient information and community trends into data that can help inform health and public policy making, and to recognize opportunities for greater involvement in the promotion of individual patient health and well-being, community development, health policy, and global health.

They are also taught how to create research-based advocacy tools, how to screen for housing, food, and energy insecurities, and how immigration status and eligibility for benefits influences health and health outcomes. Students attend sessions and complete assignments that help them develop the skills necessary to write abstracts for scientific conferences and letters to the editor.

This past spring, students in the first-year course researched and reported on resources available to patients at Boston Medical Center (BMC). They created a central database of the resources that health care providers at the hospital can access easily, streamlining the process of matching up patient need with a program or agency to help meet the need.

Mentorship is a significant component of the program. Aligned with the BU Medical Campus mission to care for the underserved, many faculty members are deeply involved in and committed to physician advocacy. "A major benefit to students is access and exposure to physician leaders who are advocates in their own right," says Dan Dworkis '13, student director of the BU ATP. "We are fortunate to be in an institution that values advocacy as one of the components of providing health care."

"Also, Dean Antman and Dr. Hughes (associate dean for academic affairs) have been incredibly supportive. Students come to BU Medical Campus because they want to work with the underserved. We aren't afraid of tackling these issues, and we also are fortunate to be led by physicians who feel the same way."

Dr. Sandel, a nationally recognized expert on housing and child health, is a former director of Pediatric Healthcare for the Homeless at BMC, a co-investigator for Children's Health Watch, and medical director of the National Center for Medical Legal Partnership.

Other BUSM faculty who mentor students and speak on topics related to the curriculum include Thea James, MD, associate professor of emergency medicine. Dr. James is director of the BMC Violence Intervention Advocacy program, which helps victims of violence recover

website that links providers with housing code enforcement agencies to help patients whose housing situation is compromising their health; and developing a pilot program to form a transdisciplinary impact team of medical, legal, educational, and business students at BU to advocate with social services agencies on behalf of residents in a public housing project to improve the residents' fiscal and physical health.

"Dan Dworkis and other students caring for homeless patients in the hospital who would need nebulizer treatments post-discharge learned that shelters would not accept them because of their medical condition and need for oxygen," said Fiechtner. "So Dr. Gaeta and a group of students contacted the shelters and found out what therapies homeless shelters could accommodate. To get the word out about these patients' struggles, they also wrote up the experience as a case study which has been accepted for publication in *Archives of Internal Medicine*."

Dworkis dreams of an institute for medical advocacy. "I think BU is uniquely positioned among medical schools in Massachusetts to be a center for medical advocacy," he says. "Advocacy is ingrained in our mission. We have phenomenal staff, and we are constantly evolving and upgrading our curriculum and reaching out to get more faculty involved. We are also energizing our alumni, who work on these issues across the country and around the world."

Sandel, who received the BUSM Committee on Faculty Affairs 2012 Educator of the Year Award in the pre-clinical sciences for her work on BU ATP, also believes physicians are key to effecting change in the public arena. "Messenger matters just as much as message," she says. "Having a physician address policy makers and legislators about why housing conditions are bad for their patients is probably stronger than having a lawyer because we are viewed as neutral. We are not talking about something that is directly related to our self-interest, like advocating for malpractice insurance changes or better reimbursement. We are asking for changes on behalf of our patients."

Currently a scholarship for students between first and second year supports research in medical advocacy. A fund, the BU Advocacy Training Program, has been established at the School of Medicine to which donors can make contributions.


"We need more financial resources to fully realize all of the potential for this kind of training," says Suzanne Sarfaty, MD '88, assistant dean for academic affairs and director of enrichment. "This is what I hope is the first of a number of scholarly concentrations that we can offer our medical students. Scholarly concentrations promote self-directed learning and provide the structure to pursue in-depth inquiry. They give students the opportunity to individuate and pursue passions that create clinical investigators and medical leaders, and provide mentors to guide future careers."

"The BU Advocacy Training Program is an example of BUSM building future leaders in medical education through an innovative, student-led, faculty-mentored curriculum," said Dean Antman. "This will become a model for medical schools throughout the country."

from their physical and emotional trauma, and co-founder of Unified for Global Healing, a nonprofit organization that provides culturally competent health services and promotes health education using multidisciplinary teams to underserved communities internationally.

Jessie Gaeta, MD, a member of the BU ATP core faculty and medical director of the Barbara McInnis House of the Boston Health Care for the Homeless program, is the co-founder of the Home & Healthy for Good program operated under the auspices of the Massachusetts Housing and Shelter Alliance. Their mission is to find permanent housing for the chronically homeless, and then treat their illnesses.

"Fundamentally, the health of our patients requires that we understand these issues," says Dworkis, who develops curriculum and written materials, helps other students lead classes, fundraises, and manages the logistics of operating the program. "We need to be leaders to help change the circumstances that affect the way our patients are living. To improve their health, we need to help change their circumstances."

Dworkis also notes that BU ATP students are exposed to other BUSM student leaders, which helps keep them passionate and engaged in advocacy. "We repeatedly hear from our students that our program is one of the things that helps keep that focus alive in them," he says.

"Our advocacy students are recognized on the floors (of the hospital) as knowledge-based resources, characterized as being acutely aware of social determinants of health in our patients and able to provide a context and access to resources when a patient is identified as having a social issue that is affecting their health. With 15 percent of BUSM students having this training, we think that almost every team includes one of our students."

Residents in the BMC-Children's Hospital Boston Combined Residency Program in pediatrics offered an excellent opportunity to link medical teams for advocacy. They developed a physician iPhone application that houses current research on advocacy. The application needs regular updating, and BUSM students in the advocacy program can be involved in the process, thereby advancing their knowledge of advocacy research while offering them the opportunity to collaborate with residents.

Some of the projects in which students in the program have participated include developing a tool kit that providers can use to help patients get food benefits that are often denied on the first request; creating a

BUSM Receives Award for Work-Life Balance Practices for Academic Physicians

The American Council on Education (ACE) and The Alfred P. Sloan Foundation have recognized Boston University School of Medicine (BUSM) for its innovative work in career flexibility for academic physicians.

The Alfred P. Sloan Award for Faculty Career Flexibility is a \$250,000 grant that BUSM will use to build on innovative existing policies and programs that facilitate professional and personal balance, while also implementing new initiatives that provide multiple levels of mentoring. Mentoring will increase career flexibility, enabling faculty to navigate the path to advancement more efficiently while avoiding burnout. Specifically, a midcareer faculty development program will be designed to promote career advancement. The School will also create an online database of mentors and facilitate communities of practice to stimulate peer and senior mentoring and foster career flexibility.

"We are committed to the quality of academic life at Boston University School of Medicine and to faculty development. This grant will support pilot programs that can be more broadly adopted, if found effective," said Dean Karen Antman, MD.

Six other medical schools also received awards that ACE established after investigating the structural and cultural barriers to faculty career flexibility in academic medicine. The awards are part of ACE's ongoing work with The Alfred P. Sloan Projects for Faculty Career Flexibility.

"By attracting and retaining the best of the best, these winning medical schools are able to put themselves on a path toward excellence," said Kathleen Christensen, program director, Alfred P. Sloan Foundation. "They do this through targeted efforts to address the unique work/life challenges faced by faculty."
