As a component of MUSC's Community Engagement (CE) program:

- <u>Community Engaged Scholars Program</u> this is a pilot award and training program for academic/community partnerships. The RFA typically releases in the fall. Several institutions have adopted and modeled a similar program.
- Our CE team also published the <u>Are We Ready? Toolkit</u>, a partnership toolkit for engaging in Community-Based Participatory Research.
