The movie, Losing Control and Panel Discussion

Former Ph.D. student and now the film's Director, Valerie Weiss says about the film; "Losing Control is loosely based on my time getting a Ph.D. in X-ray Crystallography at Harvard Medical School. I hoped to make a movie from the perspective of a female scientist about dating and show a woman trying to apply scientific principles to the search for a mate. My objective was to explore whether this was a constructive approach or not, while sharing some of the quirky characters you find in academic science. I wanted to create a character who is smart and aware and has a plan for her life, as many people do, and take it to even more of an extreme because she is a scientist. ... I wanted to take the thought of, "I can predict how my life turns out," and say, "What happens if things don't quite go according to plan?"

Following the film we will have a panel discussion that will include the film's director as well as two other interesting scientists. One of them is: Barb Cohen Ph.D. who invented the real world "Y-kill" which is used exclusively in veterinary applications by the dairy industry, to increase female calvings on dairy farms. This results in increased food production and minimizes cruelty to veal calves. After earning the Ph.D. in Biochemistry from Harvard and completing postdoctoral study at MIT, she has worked as a scientific executive in biotechnology. She is a Co-Founder of two companies directed to commercializing her discoveries in the veterinary and human sciences.

Dr. Leslie Zebrowitz, the other panelist, after receiving her Ph.D. in social psychology from Yale University, took her first job at Brandeis University, where she has been ever since. She currently holds the position of Manuel Yellen Professor of Social Relations and Professor of Psychology. Professor Zebrowitz' research has been concerned with social perception, including people's causal attributions for behavior, impression formation, and stereotyping. Her book, <u>Reading Faces</u> (1997, Westview/Perseus Press) provides a systematic account of the tendency to judge people by their appearance, specifically babyfaceness and attractiveness as well as a theoretical explanation of these impressions and their social outcomes. As you will see this evening, her work on babyfaceness inspired a subplot in *Losing Control*.

While watching the movie, think of a question you would like to ask the panel. And watch closely how art imitates life, and see the connections made to Barb and Leslie's research. Learn of academic and alternative career opportunities after your postdoctoral training. Connect to what goes on in your lab to

the movie. This event should be very interesting and a lot of fun.

These three exciting events were created to celebrate the contributions and achievements of BUMC postdocs and provide the opportunity to have fun and to meet other members of the community.
