Application Guidelines are now available for the 2015 Postdoctoral Research Fellowship Program in the Basic Sciences and Clinical/Health Services Research. The primary goal of the Program is to provide fellowships to postdoctoral fellows in Massachusetts to investigate the causes of diseases in human beings, and/or improve methods of treatment for human diseases. United States citizenship is not required.

Eligibility

Basic Science

By July 1, 2015, applicants must have completed a minimum of three years, but not more than five years, of full-time postdoctoral research.

Clinical/Health Services Research

By July 1, 2015, applicants must be at the postdoctoral research training level and enrolled in a research fellowship
