July Bike Safety Check-Up

On July 18th, 2013, Urban AdvenTours visited BUMC from 9AM to noon to run a free bike-safety check-up for the BMC/BUMC community. The check-up included a bike assessment, chain lubrication, correct tire pressure, brake adjustment, head and tail light check and a general safety check. Free 15-minute appointments were allotted to cyclists who registered with TranSComm. Additionally, all participants of the check-up were given a bike patch kit and were automatically entered into a raffle to win a bike shop gift card or an urban bike tour gift certificate (both valid for use at Urban AdvenTours). Moreover, despite limitations on time, TranSComm was proudly able to accommodate over twenty cyclists within the scheduled time span!

Newmarket Station is Open!

Newmarket station on the MBTA's Fairmount Line is now ready and open for business! Along with Four Corners/Geneva Avenue, the new commuter rail station officially opened on July 1, 2013. It is located right off Mass Ave. between the bridges at Southhampton and Mass Ave., and just a few minutes away from South Bay Center. The local area is home to over 1,000 businesses, 16,000 jobs, and \$4 billion in annual revenues -- one of the largest industrial areas within the city of Boston. Students and employees of the medical center community who live along the Fairmount Line may take advantage of this excellent transit opportunity. T fares are equivalent to the cost of taking any rapid transit line and the station is only about a 15 minute walk to Boston Medical Center and Boston University Medical Campus. For those who prefer not to walk, MBTA buses #8 and #10 also makes stops at Newmarket Station. TranSComm is happy to announce this new addition to our transportation options!

"Let It Rain!"


