CLARIFICATION:

Underrepresented Minority (URM) – A group of people who are insufficiently represented. **Underrepresented Minority in Medicine** (URiM) – Everyone in the medical profession.

All Underrepresented Minority (URM) and Underrepresented in Medicine (URiM) are self-identified.

Boston Medical Center GME follows the AAMC definition of URiM, which includes...

Black/African American Hispanic/Latino or Latinx American Indian/Alaska Native

Native Hawaiians/Other Pacific Islanders (ex: Samoan, Guamanian, Fijian, Filipino, etc.)

BMC Limited English Proficiency (LEP) Patients



In 2021 25% of BMC patients self-identified as LEP. BMC Interpreter Services Department translates for over 80 languages and dialects.

In 2021, **57%** of BMC patients self-identify as Black/African American and Hispanic/Latinx.

About 36% of the population of Boston are BMC patients.



Commitment to Boston Communities and Health Equity



Equal Treatment: Here it is assumed that everyone will benefit from the same supports

Equitable Treatment: Everyone is given different supports to provide access. Filling gaps, often temporarily Everyone has access without the need for supports. The root cause of the inequity has been addressed. Structural barriers removed.

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Commitment to Boston Communities and Health Care



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BMC's Goal: To eliminate disparities in health outcomes across different races and ethnicities.

The Boston Opportunity System (BOS) Collaborative

Launched as an initial investment of \$5 million by JP Morgan Advancing Cities Grant. BOS Collaborative is a partnership between the City of Boston, BMC, Boston Children's Hospital, and Brigham and Women's Hospital. **Goals**: job training, housing stabilization and neighborhood revitalization



The Daily Table is a grocery store built in Roxbury that focuses on healthy, fresh culturally diverse foods.





StreetCred

Provides free tax preparation services, financial coaching and planning, and job training within the field of tax preparations.



Housing Prescription as Health Care (HPHC)

Helps families experiencing homelessness and housing instability in Boston by using a multidimensional approach to address the specific needs of each family.





Preventative Food Pantry

Established in 2001 as the 1st hospitalbased food pantry in the country.



Rooftop Farm

Provides fresh, local produce to the Preventative Food Pantry, the cafeterias, our hospitalized patients and our demonstration kitchen.
