Dr. Tang is an addiction psychiatrist and clinician scientist at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH) and Assistant Professor in the Dept. of Psychiatry at the University of Toronto conducting translational clinical research and clinical trials. His research focus is on the development of novel, non-invasive neurostimulation treatments for substance use disorders. His current projects are focused on pilot randomized controlled trials of repetitive transcranial magnetic stimulation for patients with addictions and comorbid mood disorders.

### Annie Levesque, MD, MSc

Dr. Levesque is an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. She is also the Medical Director of the Opioid Treatment Program and Associate Director of the Addiction Medicine Fellowship Program at Mount Sinai West Hospital. Her past research work focused on the impact of psychiatric disorders on risk behaviors for the transmission of HIV and Hepatitis C. She is currently co-investigator of a NIH funded clinical trial aiming to evaluate the effectiveness of cannabidiol to reduce craving for opioid in patients with opioid use disorder.

### Declan Barry, PhD

Dr. Barry is a liscensed clinical psychologist and an Associate Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and the Child Study Center at Yale School of Medicine. He is the Founding Director of the APT Foundation Pain Treatment Services. His research is aimed at developing and evaluating treatments for co-occurring opioid use disorder and chornic pain, and examining the role of sociocultural, psychological, and biological facors in the occurrence and treatment of pain and addictions. Dr. Barry has published over 100 peer-reviewed articles, is a multiple principal investigator on two NIH funded studies, and Associate Editor of the *Journal of Immigrant and Minority Health* and is Co-Editor of the Substance Use Disorder Section at *Pain Medicine*.
