

CityLab Biotechnology Summer Program for Middle School Students at BSC CityLab



Dear Parents/Guardians:

Is your son or daughter interested in science and nature? Would your child like to work with scientists to solve a *Whale of a Mystery* at a week-long program this summer? The science faculty at Bridgewater State College is offering a biotechnology summer program for middle school-aged students through our BSC CityLab. This program is open to any student entering Grades 6 - 9 in the fall of 2009. Students in the program will conduct scientific research to solve a mystery based on current scientific and legal proceedings.

Bridgewater State College's CityLab has offered Whale of a Mystery each summer since 2001. Faculty from Biology, Chemistry, and English developed this program through a National Institutes of Health (NIH) grant, which fully subsidized the program development and has funded the participation of more than 400 students. The extremely positive feedback and results we have received from Whale of a Mystery parents, students, and external evaluators indicate that we have a very valuable offering.

Two sessions of Whale of a Mystery will be offered this summer. Session I will be held $\underline{July\ 6^{th}-10^{th}}$ and Session II will be $\underline{July\ 13^{th}-17^{th}}$. The program will run daily from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm. The <u>fee is \$250 per student</u>. We anticipate that some scholarships will be available to cover program costs for families with financial need.

About Whale of a Mystery

Every year, endangered or protected species of whales are hunted and their meat illegally sold in foreign fish markets. Until now, the International Whaling Commission has not been able to prove that this is occurring. Students participating in the program will be called upon to solve a "mystery" by determining if a sample of "whale" meat comes from an endangered species. They will use the latest biotechnology techniques and the same scientific equipment used in research labs. Your child will have fun and be challenged while working with others to investigate and solve this mystery. In addition to the laboratory work, students will study local whales, including humpback and minke whales. On Wednesday (rain date Thursday), BSC will bus the participants to Plymouth

Harbor and take a whale watch voyage to view these gentle giants. A cetologist (whale expert) will be available to answer their questions and to teach them exciting facts about the different species of whales. The program will conclude with a mock congressional hearing on Friday. The participants will create presentations based on their lab work and defend their scientific studies as expert witnesses. Family and friends will be invited to attend and help us judge whether or not something illegal is happening to our protected whale species.

How to Apply

The enclosed application materials contain two parts. Part A is the general application to be filled in by all applicants. Part B is a required student questionnaire and teacher evaluation to be completed for those applicants seeking a scholarship. <u>The application for students seeking</u> scholarships must be postmarked by Saturday, May 16th, 2009.

Students applying for scholarships will be evaluated on financial need and enthusiasm for science, as judged from the responses to the questionnaire and teacher evaluations. Final decisions for the scholarship applicants are made in June. All other applicants will be confirmed on a continuing basis until the program fills. <u>Please be aware that transportation and lunch are the responsibility of the parent/quardian</u>.

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
