Participating in the "Respect" Registry:

What is the "Respect" Registry?

The purpose of the Respect registry is to match people who want to be told about research studies to those studies that they might want to be in at Boston University Medical Campus (BUMC) and Boston Medical Center (BMC).

What is research?

Research is done to answer a question. Research can include many different kinds of studies like surveys, medical record reviews, tests of medicines or other interventions. Research is the way new treatments are discovered and tested.

Why join this registry?

There is a lot that we don't know about how to prevent and treat health conditions or diseases and stay healthy. Some people may want to join a registry because they have had or know someone who has some particular health problem. Participating in research can help find a cure or better way to provide care. Others may want to join to be a part in finding new ways to treat these problems. This registry will help match you to research studies that you might want to participate in.

How does this registry work?

First you will fill out a brief questionnaire (see attached). Then, if there are research studies (including other registries) at BUMC that might be of interest to you, the registry staff will contact you. If you are already a Boston Medical Center (BMC) patient, the registry staff will look at your medical records to help see if a study might be right for you. We may also send you information about studies that are ongoing. If you want to hear more, the registry staff will have people who work on these studies contact you. They may tell you more about the study and ask you some more questions. Then, you will be able to decide if you want to be in the study or not. Being in any of these studies is voluntary—it is your choice. There is no charge to you or your health insurance for being in the Respect registry. You will also receive occasional newsletters to tell you about studies at BUMC and BMC. Annual updates will be requested from you to identify any changes in your information and will be kept in the registry with the original information collected. The purpose of the update is to identify changes in your contact information and to update the registry record.

How will my privacy be protected?

Only registry staff will have access to any information collected for the registry. Your information will be kept locked in the cabinets and in computer files that are protected by passwords. Your health information will be kept separate from your contact information. All registry staff members are trained in handling your private and confidential information.

Are there any risks or benefits?

The main risk, which is unlikely, is that someone else outside the registry could find out your personal health information. Information in your medical records at BMC for all registry members including BUMC/BMC employees may become known to the registry staff. There may be no benefits to you, except to find out about health research studies at BUMC/BMC that you might be interested in. Can I change my mind and leave the registry? Yes. Just contact the registry at 617-638-8962. Do I have to be in this registry to get care at BMC?

No. Being or not being in this registry has nothing to do with the care you receive at BMC. Whether or not you choose to be included in the registry does not affect your care you regularly receive at BUMC or BMC. Participation in the registry is voluntary. Refusal to participate in the registry will involve no penalty or loss of benefits to which you are otherwise entitled, and you may discontinue participation at any time without penalty or loss of benefits to which you are otherwise entitled as a patient at Boston Medical Center.



Boston University/Boston Medical Center (BU/BMC) invites you to join the ReSPECT Registry!

The ReSPECT Registry is a way for people to hear about research studies they might want to participate in.

What happens when I join the ReSPECT Registry?

When you join the Registry, we ask you to fill out a survey about you and your interests in clinical research. We keep your information secure and use it to find studies that may be of interest to you. The Registry staff may contact you about studies you might be interested in. These studies could be surveys, interviews, or other examinations; studies to find new and better tests and treatments; and other types of studies. You can choose whether you want to be in or learn more about these studies. Some studies offer payment or compensation, and others do not.

What is the purpose of the ReSPECT Registry?

There are thousands of people who join research studies in the United States every day. There are also many people who may want to, but do not know how to join a study. It is sometimes hard for people to find studies that are looking for volunteers. The ReSPECT Registry can help you find studies at BU/BMC that are looking for volunteers, then learn about and connect with them.

How do I join?

Signing up is free. There is no cost to you for joining the Registry. We ask that you first read the two-page information sheet about the Registry, and then answer a few survey questions about yourself.

Signing up is convenient. You can join the Registry in person at one of our information tables at BU/BMC or at meetings in the community, on the Web at www.bumc.bu.edu/ctro-community/ReSPECT, or by calling (toll free) 877-505-4455.


Submit your information to the Registry. Once you submit your information to the Registry in person, over the phone, or on the website, you will be contacted by the Registry team and sent an e-mail and/or a letter welcoming you to the Registry. You will receive periodic information about the Registry, community presentations and/or talks, and a newsletter with information about studies you may be interested in and other information about clinical research.




ReSPECT Registry Race Demographics

How Can Investigators Connect?

Using the Registry

- Investigators contact the Registry with basic information, their inclusion/exclusion criteria, and their IRB Protocol # (if study is already approved).
- Registry staff review inclusion/exclusion criteria to search the database for potential volunteers (Example: Black females, age 55 and up, who have diabetes).
 - Health information can be searched via the Clinical Data Warehouse
- To move forward, investigators can then create a contact message and submit either with the IRB application or with an amendment to use the Registry
- Registry staff contact Registry members via email, postal mail, or phone to inform them about the study. Registry members can contact the investigator themselves or Registry staff can have the research team contact them individually.

Guide to Using the ReSPECT Registry for Recruitment

Thank you for your interest in the ReSPECT Registry. The ReSPECT Registry is a tool to help BU/BMC investigators find subjects to participate in their research studies. Registry members are recruited from Boston Medical Center and surrounding communities.

To gain access to the ReSPECT Registry, please follow the below steps:

(Click here for an [electronic Guide to Using the ReSPECT Registry](#).)

1. Contact the Registry at respect@bu.edu to notify us that you intend to use the Registry.
 - We can send you an electronic version of this guideline, as well as an estimate of how many Registry members may potentially be eligible for your study.
2. Create a "ReSPECT Contact Message" that will be sent to Registry members by our staff to inform them about your study. Click here for a [Sample ReSPECT Registry Contact Message](#). We ask that you send us your contact message for review and then submit it to the IRB. It will need to be approved by the IRB.
3. Submit a request to the IRB to add the Registry as a recruitment method.
 - Attach your ReSPECT Contact Message to the IRB application.
 - In the "RECRUITMENT" section of your IRB application, list that you will be utilizing the ReSPECT Registry (Protocol Number H-28505) as a recruitment method.
 - If you already have IRB-approved brochures, flyers, or other recruitment material that you would like to be distributed along with your ReSPECT Contact Message, please indicate in your amendment that these materials will be sent to Registry members.
 - Sample language for the "Recruitment" section of your IRB application:
The ReSPECT Registry will be used as a recruitment method. The ReSPECT Registry staff will contact potential study participants per the IRB approved procedures described in H-28505. The ReSPECT Contact Message [and additional recruitment materials to send to Registry members if applicable] is/are attached.
4. E-mail us your IRB approval letter.
5. With IRB approval confirmed, the Registry team will generate a list from the Registry database to target and recruit for your study. You will need to send a list of inclusion/exclusion criteria to the Registry Staff.





Preconception Care Study Cold Calling Results November 5, 2012





How Can Investigators Connect?

Consultation Services

- **Common Barriers to Recruitment**
 - Concerns about personal safety and loss of confidentiality
 - Consents are getting longer and more complex
 - Goals of research are not well understood
 - Subjects often do not get results from the study
 - Cultural competence and sensitivity
 - Unprepared study staff

Community Outreach & Education

- To provide a better understanding of what the community needs in healthcare
- To relay some of the community's current concerns regarding health and safety about a study.



- Diverse participation in research studies can improve the community's understanding of certain diseases or conditions that exist in the community
- Study results and/or examples shared with a community may help individuals to take personal action and change behavior to improve their health.

From INSPIR Study Summary (optional)

The Memory Disorders Research Center provides the clinical and administrative core for a number of research programs aimed at understanding the cognitive and neural basis of the memory deficits seen in subjects with a variety of neurological disorders such as stroke, aneurysm, head injury, encephalitis, anoxia and Korsakoff syndrome. The primary objective of this project is to put in place a uniform method of recruitment of participants into the MDRC and to provide a full characterization of participants' neuropsychological functioning. This in turn, provides the information necessary to allow assignment of participants to the various ongoing research projects. In addition to subjects with memory disorders, the MDRC also recruits as control participants normal individuals without a history of neurological illness and individuals with a history of alcohol abuse. The neuropsychological evaluation of subjects with memory disorders is comprehensive, and consists of standardized tests of general intelligence, language, memory, perception and problem solving. The evaluation of control participants is restricted to the areas of general intelligence and memory. Results of these tests provide the necessary information to determine for which research projects a participant is eligible. ,
