- 2. Complete the 2019 GMS Photo Release Form
- 3. Complete the Fuller Gym Release Form
- 4. Take the time to learn about the Office of the Ombuds
- 5. Complete the Mandatory Student Training on Sexual Misconduct (NOTE: this will not be available until September)
