

## Provisional Dissertations and Theses Signature Process (Spring 2022)

Interim procedure continued effective until May 31, 2022 (extended from an original expiration date of May 31, 2020, September 30, 2020, January 31, 2021, May 31, 2021, September 30, 2021, and January 31, 2022): Boston University Libraries is adjusting the policy outlined in the Guide for Writers of Theses and Dissertations requiring original signatures on the Readers' Approval page. Until May 31, 2022, the Libraries will accept electronic signatures, including scanned signatures, on thesis and dissertation readers' approval pages.

The Libraries need the following in order to implement this change:

- College/school thesis/dissertation administrators submit signature pages to <a href="mailto:theses@bu.edu">theses@bu.edu</a>.
  - Completed readers' approval pages in PDF format should be transmitted by college/school administrators to <a href="mailto:theses@bu.edu">theses@bu.edu</a>. BU Libraries will accept such transmissions from thesis/ dissertation coordinators listed in the enclosed Appendix.
- Use PDF format for the signature page.
  - One multi-page PDF file with a single signature on each page will be accepted. The Libraries
    prefers that all signatures be gathered on one page, if possible.
- Use the naming convention FirstnameLastnameSigPage.pdf
  - In order to ensure proper attribution, the approval page PDF files transmitted should be named according to the convention FirstnameLastnameSigPage.pdf (for example, JaneSmithSigPage. pdf for a degree candidate named Jane Smith).

Students will need to work directly with the thesis/dissertation coordinator in their School or College to submit their fully signed readers' approval page file. Digital signatures are acceptable using available tools such as Adobe Reader and DocuSign.
