APPLYING FOR FINANCIAL AID

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- Available only to U.S. Citizens, U.S. Permanent Residents and Eligible Noncitizens
- Boston University School Code: 002130
- Parental information is not required on the FAFSA.
- The FAFSA is available as of October 1
- Early submission is encouraged
- Applications will be reviewed after your mutual accept with BU Chobanian and Avedisian School of Medicine Graduate Medical Sciences (GMS)
- Eligible GMS students may receive up to \$20,500 in Federal Unsubsidized Direct Loans on an annual basis

TYPES OF AID

Federal Loans: Federal Unsubsidized Direct Loans are offered to students who qualify, based on your application for financial aid. These loans generally offer more favorable terms than private, credit-based loans. The loan is unsubsidized and interest begins accruing once the money is applied to your student account.

Scholarships: Merit-based scholarships are awarded upon acceptance to selected students by GMS Admissions and not during the financial aid process. Terms and conditions regarding the amount received, and renewal requirements can be found in your notice of acceptance from GMS Admissions.

COST OF ATTENDANCE (COA)

The cost of attendance (COA) sets a limit on the total aid that you may receive. The COA is not the bill that you get; it is the total amount it would cost you to attend GMS each year. It includes direct and indirect expenses and is based on the length of the period of enrollment. SFS reviews the COA annually. Visit our website for the current COA for your program:

Graduate Federal Direct PLUS Loan

The Graduate Federal Direct PLUS is a federal credit-based loan, available to students who are eligible for the Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan. To apply you must submit the **Graduate Federal Direct PLUS Request Form** found on our website.

Private Credit-Based Loans
