- Increase access to accurate and reliable health information
- Reach communities with health disparities
- Promote NLM resources

- Tailored efforts based on findings
- Community-based partnerships

Community Assessment

Western Maine, Rural Seniors



Findings

- Rural with growing senior population
- Growing African immigrant community
- Healthy communities coalitions as partners
- Strong school health program
- Broadband is limited, libraries offer access

Community Assessment

Providence RI, Latino communities

Findings

- Questions about health information first consult is with people they know
- Existing network of minority health centers
- Radio is important medium, long-standing Spanish language health program
- Foreign-trained health professionals organized at adult education center

Focused Outreach Implementation

Western Maine, Rural Seniors

Tailored Approach

- Target core outreach activities to needs of seniors
- Develop partnerships with healthy communities coalitions; provide stipends for outreach to seniors
- Promoted NLM resources via trainings, exhibits, community organizations, public libraries,

Focused Outreach Implementation

Providence RI, Latino communities

Tailored Approach

- Implement a train the trainer model
- Partner with Welcome Back Center, cohort of trainers from students
- Spanish language pieces promoting ML+ via radio discussion/interview
- Link WBC/adult education center with Providence Community Library

Method

Evaluation



- Outcome measures : pre-post training evaluations, follow-up assessment
- Process measures: story-based evaluation, community partner exit interviews

Evaluation Results

Western Maine – Rural Seniors

Outputs

Service providers trained =98

Consumers reached =154

Consumer pre-/post-evaluations =85

Service provider pre-/post-evaluations =82

Consumer Follow-up =13

Service Provider Follow-up = 28

Evaluation Results

Providence RI – Work with WBC

Outputs

Train the trainer cohort size =5

Providers trained =98

Instruction sessions to consumers =37

Consumers reached =851

One extended discussion with Q & A on MedlinePlus en español on radio health program




Maine Seniors

post reporting confidence in using net/HI=79%







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
Not Maine Post Test responses: Likely to Use / Share NLM Resources






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


Service Providers reporting Sharing of NLM at follow up
