





Updates from the Patient Navigator Program

From Katie Finn:

I am writing to highlight the wonderful work of the Oncology and Sickle Cell Patient Navigators (PNs) in 2020 and to share exciting updates on the program. We have a new PN, Talissa Adrien, joining the team on 2/16. Talissa most recently worked at the RIAN Immigration Center and has also volunteered at ABCD Boston. Talissa speaks haitian-creole, french and intermediate spanish. Please find the updated PN contact sheet attached. We are still determining the new disease breakdown. Please join me in welcoming Talissa to BMC!

In 2020, we saw a slight decrease in new referrals to the PN program, however, the team was quick to make up for any extra downtime by helping the HemOnc clinic reach out to all patients with in person appointments to conduct COVID-19 screening calls. The team made approximately 2,900 screening calls from March - August and reviewed an additional ~ 3,000 appointments to determine whether outreach was necessary (screening completed within 48 hrs, appointment changed to telemed, etc). Federal IDC, fringe and patient care rates for Fiscal Year 2021

BMC has completed negotiations on our federal IDC, fringe, and patient care rates for Fiscal Year 2021. The rates are as follows:

- On Campus Research 75.0%
- Off-Site Research 34.0%
- Other Sponsored Activity 48.0%
- Training Grants 8%
- Fringe 32.5% (all employees)

Please note that only our On Campus Research rate changed from 78% to 75%. We will be processing retro adjustments on IDC rates for all sponsored projects awarded at the 78% IDC rate going back to the start of FY21 (October 1, 2020). This adjustment will decrease your IDC expense for these projects. You will see this adjustment in your January reports, once the month has closed.

New NIH Minimum Postdoc Salary

The current NIH minimum of \$53,706 should be in effect for all postdocs as of July 1, 2021. Faculty and units that wish to raise their postdocs' salaries or stipends in advance of July 1, 2021, may do so, effective immediately.
