# **BU Recognizes Juneteenth as Official Holiday**

Boston University now recognizes Juneteenth as an official holiday and will rename the October Columbus Day holiday Indigenous Peoples' Day on its calendar, part of an ongoing effort to make BU "the diverse, equitable, and inclusive community that best embodies our values," President Robert A. Brown announced in a letter sent to the University community on Thursday. Juneteenth, long celebrated in the African American community, is traditionally observed on June 19, marking the day in 1865 when the last enslaved people in America—in Texas, where the holiday began—were told they were free. Also known as Freedom Day, Jubilee Day, Liberation Day, or Emancipation Day, it is already celebrated in most states. This year is the first year that it's an official holiday in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. <u>Read more</u>


# Sickle Cell Disease, Today & Tomorrow: Celebrating World Sickle Cell Day

### Lab Clean Out Summer 2021



Environmental Health and Safety (EHS) has announced plans for a BU wide laboratory clean-up initiative in August 2021. At least once a year, groups are encouraged to go through all of their chemical storage, sample freezers, and controlled substances safes, carefully examining each container, then discarding items that have expired, degraded, or are of no immediate use. During the summer lab clean-up period, EHS will be offering easy pick-ups for unwanted or defective chemicals, specimens, radiological materials, and controlled substances, as well as laser decommissioning.

While conducting a laboratory clean-out, please closely examine every container for expiration date, continued usefulness, gross contamination, structural integrity, and reagent degradation, such as peroxide crystal formation, aldehydes with carboxylic acid solids, chemical discoloration and/or oxidation, etc. Please review the links to BU's <u>highly hazardous chemicals list</u>, the Department of Homeland Security's <u>CFATS COI list</u>, and BU's <u>peroxide formers guidance</u>, as these chemicals require special care.


