#### **Donating Supplies to Haitian Relief Efforts**



BMC is collecting supplies to aid in the Haitian relief efforts, following the devastating 7.2 magnitude earthquake. Two collection boxes have been placed on Yawkey 6th floor (residents' room and outside of administrative office) and will remain through September 12 at which point the supplies will be shipped to Haiti.

Needed supplies include: canned tuna, salmon, rice, beans, spaghetti, crackers, diapers, clothes for children and adults, toiletries, flashlights, batteries, tents, mosquito nets, Band-Aids, hydrogen peroxide, alcohol, water, gloves, masks, Tylenol, first aid kits, wound care kits.

Additionally, our colleagues who have ongoing partnerships with clinicians and relief organizations in Haiti have provided a list of reputable nonprofit organizations for those looking to support relief efforts with a donation: 2021 Mass Haitian Relief Task Force via HAU, Equal Health, Health Equity International, and Partners in Health.





#### **MBTA Pass Order Deadline: September 5**

The deadline to enroll in, cancel, or change your MBTA pass is the 5th of the month prior to the effective month. For example, the deadline for your October MBTA pass is September 5.

Charlie Card/Link Pass: If you have lost your MBTA pass, your card doesn't work, or you have inquiries regarding any credits owed to you, please reach out to Commuter Benefit Solutions directly for their assistance.

Commuter Rail Passes: If your commuter rail pass is not received, or lost, you may be reimbursed by purchasing a replacement pass at full price, and submitting a claim reimbursement form and a receipt to Commuter Benefit Solutions. All reimbursement for passes lost or not received must be submitted by the 10th of the prior month. Please note that members are only eligible for one claim approval within a calendar year.

#### **COVID-19 Vaccination Workplace Requirement**

The BMC COVID-19 vaccination requirement deadline is October 15, 2021. By that date, all LIPs must either obtain at least one vaccine dose and share their vaccination information into the BMCHS Employee Health Portal OR receive an approved exemption, which must be requested by September 17. There will be very few exemptions approved.

Employee Vaccination Clinic Hours and New On-Demand Option Walk-in vaccinations are available at the ground floor Dowling clinic location at 850 Harrison Avenue. Departments may also page a COVAX nurse at 2829 to come vaccinate employees ondemand in ambulatory clinics, the ED, and inpatient floors.

Dowling Hours of Operation: Mon, Wed, Fri: 6 a.m. – 2 p.m. Tues, Thurs: 12 p.m. – 8 p.m. Sat, August 21: 7 a.m. – 12 p.m.

COVAX (on-demand) Hours of Operation: Mon – Fri: 8 a.m. – 5:30 p.m. Evenings by request





#### **BMC Cancer Research Innovator Awards**

The BU-BMC Cancer Center is delighted to announce that Boston Medical Center is sponsoring a new research grant program to support junior faculty at the beginning of their careers who are performing innovative research in cancer and areas related to cancer. Research may include basic, translational, or clinical research; priority will be given to innovative projects with the potential to significantly increase understanding of underlying cancer mechanisms, lead to the development of new therapeutic strategies, or otherwise positively impact cancer care. Funding will be for one year, in the amount of \$50,000. Candidates must be in the first four years of their faculty appointment and must work in BMC space.
