



Researchers from Mount Sinai, Boston Medical Center, and Boston University have released Giotto Suite (described in a recent Nature Methods publication), a flexible software platform for integrating and visualizing spatial multiomics data across tissue contexts. The tool streamlines workflows that previously required combining multiple packages, helping investigators focus more on scientific insight than technical hurdles.

# **New Ambient AI Tool to Support Documentation**

Our department has been selected to take part in BMC's ambient AI rollout. This initiative is part of a broader effort to reduce the documentation burden on providers and improve both the care experience and provider wellbeing. Earlier this year, BMC piloted ambient AI technology, and 83% of participants reported faster note completion and patient experience scores improved.

#### How it works:

This new technology, provided by Abridge, captures your conversation during a patient visit (with consent) and drafts a note directly into Epic. You retain full control of the note and can review and edit as needed.

#### Getting started:

- 1) Log in to Workday Learning
- 2) Search for "Ambient AI Provider Training Course"
- 3) Complete two quick lessons:
- § Lesson 1: Watch training video(s) and review tip sheets
- § Lesson 2: Select your device type (iOS or Android), complete a brief pre-Survey, and complete the attestation

Once completed, you'll receive access on Wednesday, Oct. 1. If you have questions or need help, please contact Kristen Kremer, Director Ambulatory Performance.

## Government Shutdown - what to know

#### **Shutdown Impacts and Considerations**

- Adhere to posted guidelines for grant submissions or nominations: Faculty should follow posted guidelines and deadlines for grant applications. In the past, some agencies have extended proposal deadlines after the government reopens. You should continue to submit proposals as long as federal systems remain operational.
- Prepare for award announcements to be delayed: Faculty waiting on award
  announcements for already submitted proposals should know that a government shutdown
  may lead to delays in award announcements. Past government shutdowns have led to
  delays of several weeks to months due to the backlog of work at federal agencies and the
  difficulty of rescheduling review panels once the government reopens. Similarly, expected
  new grant programs will be delayed as the federal government is not allowed to establish
  new grant programs during a government shutdown.
- Stay up-to-date: COGR has created a <u>website</u> of resources consolidating information.


