I work in a large integrated health system called Lovelace Health System. Our group provides multispecialty cardiac care for all of New Mexico. In addition to my clinical responsibilities I also rotate at the University of New Mexico Hospital and provide electrophysiology services there including caring for patients and working with fellows. I have several administrative responsibilities including being the medical director of our cardiac device clinic.
