

While being treated for breast cancer in 2007, South End artist Gisela Griffith learned that many drugs used in cancer treatment are derived from plants, some of which we see in our city parks and tend in our own gardens. Inspired by the impact of nature on the art and science of medicine, Gisela created botanical 'portraits' in various media as a personal expression of gratitude. While experiencing a creative block, she turned to embroidery, which she found to be the perfect medium for sharing concept with patients currently in chemo treatment.
