The Department of OB-GYN at Boston University Medical Center is recruiting for a full-time Academic Gynecologic Oncologist

We seek candidates whose experience, teaching, research, and community service has prepared them to contribute to our commitment to diversity and excellence. The ideal candidate for this position has a passion for the care of underserved women.

Emphasizing community-based care, Boston Medical Center (BMC) is the largest safety-net hospital in New England and is committed to providing consistently excellent and accessible health services to all. The hospital is also the primary teaching affiliate of the nationally ranked Boston University School of Medicine. Boston University is a world class research institution with more that \$250 million in research grants each year. BMC is more than a hospital. It is a network of support and care that touches the lives of hundreds of thousands of people in need each year. The institution has a strong focus on public health, both domestic and global, and a commitment to women's health. Our OB-GYN ambulatory care clinic is a busy academic practice, with approximately 55,000 visits per year. We are a full service tertiary care referral group of 35 physicians, 22 CNMs, and 6 NPs. The hospital boasts advanced minimally invasive surgical capabilities with both the DaVinci Xi robotic platform and the Pinpoint system for conventional laparoscopic sentinel lymph node identification.

Our clinical services and research programs are focused on eliminating disparities in health care. We have a fully accredited OB/GYN residency program with five residents per year. Although this position has primarily clinical responsibilities, all faculty members hold academic positions at Boston University School of Medicine and are expected to contribute to the education of medical students and OB/GYN residents. Our division is an active collaborator in research with co-investigators in medical oncology, radiation oncology, and pathology. The division of gynecologic oncology is growing and our ideal candidate is enthusiastic about building a division as well as strengthening academic and administrative collaborations with the BMC Cancer Care Center.

Minimum qualifications:

- Applicants must possess an MD/DO degree from an accredited medical school and have or be eligible to obtain a Massachusetts Medical License.
- Applicants must be board certified or be an active candidate for board certification in Obstetrics and Gynecology.
- Applicants must have completed a Fellowship in Gynecologic Oncology
- Fluency in languages other than English is highly desirable, but not required

Applicants must have the ability to work collegially within a diverse environment and demonstrate a commitment to our institutional values regarding diversity, equity, and inclusion.
