General Overview of LRPs

About the LRPs

NIH Loan Repayment Programs (LRPs) are a **vital component** in our nation's effort to keep health professionals in research careers

Here's how it works:

YOU: Commit to perform research for 2 years

NIH: Repays up to \$35,000/year of your qualified educational debt <u>and</u> covers resulting Federal taxes (39%)

Outcome: Increase in nation's stock of biomedical research scientists





Description of LRPs

5 Extramural NIH LRPs:

For individuals conducting research at non-profit Institutions

[©]Clinical Research

 Patient-oriented research conducted with human subjects or materials of human origin (including cognitive phenomenon) on the causes and consequences of disease in humans

Pediatric Research

- Research related to diseases or disorders in children
- Basic research allowed

Contraception & Infertility Research

- Research focusing on conditions impacting ability to conceive or bear children
- Applications reviewed by Eunice Kennedy Shriver NICHD

*Health Disparities Research

- Research focusing on minority and other health disparity populations
- Basic, clinical, social and behavioral research allowed
- Applications reviewed by NIMHD

Clinical Research DB

- Same as Clinical Research LRP
- Available to clinical researchers from verifiable disadvantaged backgrounds
- Reviewed by NIMHD

Basic Eligibility and Qualifying Loans

Basic LRP Eligibility Criteria

Extramural



M.D., Ph.D., or equivalent

Exception: Contraception & Infertility Research LRP



Domestic nonprofit, university, or government organization; **NIH grant support NOT required**



U.S. Citizen or permanent resident



At least 20% of applicant's annual income



At least 20 hours/week





Qualifying Loans


NIH WILL Repay:

- Educational loans backed by the U.S. government
- Educational loans from accredited U.S. academic institutions and commercial lenders


NIH Will NOT Repay:

- Non-educational loans (e.g. home equity loans)
- PLUS loans to parents
 - <u>EXCEPTION</u>: PLUS loans disbursed to graduate and professional students on or after July 1, 2006, qualify for LRP repayment
- Loans from non-US governments or institutions
- Loans converted to a service obligation, delinquent or in default
- Loans consolidated with another individual (e.g. spouse or child)
- Loans of full-time Federal government employees or VA Fellows





Extramural LRP Application Cycle Timeline



Important LRP Application Components

You will need to submit the following information within the Research tab of the online application

- Biosketch
- Personal Statement
- Training/Mentoring Plan or Career Development Plan
- Research Activities
- Research Environment
- Research Accomplishments (Renewal Applicants Only)
- Loan Information



The Application – Major Sections

- Biosketch
- Personal Information and Employment
 - Contact information; citizenship; employing organization and title
- Research Activities
 - Personal Statement include previous research training experience, how you developed your scientific interests, background and accomplishments; short and long-term career goals
 - Training/Career Development Plan What skills, etc do you need to acquire along your path to independent researcher (e.g., training and professional development opportunities; grantmanship workshops, conference attendance, etc) *include timelines*
 - Proposed Research Plans Describe planned research activities, specific roles/responsibilities over next 2 years – *include timelines*
- Research Environment
- Loan Information (new applicants only)
 - Lender and servicer information, loan number, total loan amounts, loan status (e.g., in repayment/forbearance)

What Are Reviewers Looking For?

Reviewers evaluate applicant's *potential to succeed* in a research career by rating:

- Applicant's previous training and research experience
- Applicant's commitment to a research career
- Strength and quality of letters of recommendation
- Quality and appropriateness of the research environment
- Research progress (for Renewal applications only)



Tips for Writing a Competitive LRP Application

These tips will help you strengthen your application.

- Know the funding priorities of the NIH Institute or Center that will review your application
- Effectively demonstrate your qualifications and commitment to research.
- Describe resources and support thoroughly.
- Write a strong research plan.
- Provide strong letters of recommendation.

Get Ahead of the Curve, Start Now!


- 1. Contact your lender to get specific loan information (including account numbers and amounts owed)
- Read LRP website and published notices and determine which NIH LRP is the right one for you
- 3. Talk to your mentor and potential recommender about your interest in applying for the NIH Loan Repayment Program
- 4. Talk to an NIH LRP Program Officer/Liaison
- 5. Make sure you have an eRA Commons ID











FY 2016 LRP Awards, by Program

Clinical - Disadvantaged








FY 2016 LRP Applications & Awards, by Gender






FY 2016 LRP Awards, by Degree Type



Other Degrees 26 (2% of awards)




Educational Debt Level, New Awardees



79% of new awardees had educational debt greater than \$50,000 **16% of new awardees had educational debt greater than \$200,000**




NIH LRP 2016 Awards, by IC




LOGIN



- All sections of the application are displayed in tabbed format at the top of the page
- 2. Status of completion for each page indicated as follows:
 - If form is complete, the green icon displayed next to it.
 - If form is not complete, the red icon displayed next to it.
- 3. Extramural applicants also select information about
 - Application and program type, award length, mentored/independent status, preferred IC

NIH eRA Commons ID

 All applicants (new and renewal) and mentors/recommenders <u>required</u> to have an NIH eRA Commons ID to submit an application

One Application Submission Deadline

 Same application submission deadline for applicants, colleague and institutional support documentation – Nov 16th!


Please DO NOT WAIT to the last minute to apply!

• Lots of required documents, and some applicants and recommenders/mentors were unfamiliar with new system.....



Summary

- 5 Extramural LRPs
- eRA Commons ID Required
- NIH LRPs will repay:
 - Up to \$70K over 2 yrs in educational loan repayment
 - Depending on debt level
 - Coverage of most Federal taxes resulting from the NIH LRP
 - 2 year initial contracts
 - 1 or 2 year competitive renewals
 - Approximately 1,600 researchers funded yearly
 - 50% application success rate overall
 - Important potential changes to the programs (e.g., 21St CC Bill)
