Guide to Your Chobanian and Avedisian School of Medicine Financial Aid Award – Incoming Student Supplement

<u>Acknowledge your award</u> on the <u>MyApplication Portal</u>. Doing so affirms that you understand and agree to all terms and conditions specified in this guide. Please carefully note all instructions.

Types of BUSM Need-Based Aid

- **Merit Scholarship**: Institutional merit scholarships are determined through the admissions process and notifications are sent along with your acceptance letter. SFS does not determine eligibility for any institutional merit scholarships.
- Need-Based Scholarship: Need-Based aid enables you to plan for the cost of your entire degree. BU financial aid is guaranteed for four years of study provided you meet satisfactory academic progress standards and remain enrolled at least part-time. If you have not completed the CSS Profile and wish to be considered for need-based financial aid, you may still do so. Visit the <u>Applying for Aid</u> page for more information.
 - If you are a recipient of an endowed scholarship, you may be asked to compose "thank you" letters to donors. Additionally, you may be asked to attend the annual Scholarship Dinner. Members of the Chobanian and Avedisian School of Medicine Development Office will be in contact with you, if you are required to participate in further contact with scholarship donors.
- Medical Student Residence (MSR) Grant/Scholarship: This award provides a monthly discount to the charged Medical Student Residence (MSR) rent on your student account. Recipients of the MSR Housing Grant/Scholarship are required to live in the MSR Residence at 815 Albany Street to maintain eligibility for the grant/scholarship. The MSR Housing Grant will be removed if the recipient of the grant moves out of the MSR.
- **Need-Based Loan**: BUMC Need-Based Loans are interest free and payment deferred while you are in medical school and for 12 months following graduation. In some cases, graduates can continue to defer interest and payments during residency.
 - Entrance Counseling is designed to assist you in understanding the rights and responsibilities that you are assuming as a borrower through the Federal Direct Loan Program and/or the BUMC loan program. Completing an Entrance Counseling session is required in order to receive the first disbursement of your loans as a Chobanian and Avedisian School of Medicine student.
 - After Orientation, you can register for a group entrance counseling session by responding to the notification that will be sent to your BU email account. Sessions fill up fast so register ASAP! For more information, please visit our <u>Entrance</u> <u>Counseling</u> page.

Personal Budgeting

As part of Entrance Counseling, applicants who choose to matriculate to Chobanian and Avedisian School of Medicine are required to attend a 30-minute personal budgeting session with a member of Student Financial Services (SFS). Prior to the session, all students will be required to complete a personal budgeting worksheet.
